


- ) We have so many branches of the family that much of the work we do is a dup-lication of effort.






MONEY TALK

(see section on Allred Books). He now has over 10,000 names on record, a large percentage of which are fully linked. Without Don's work this newsletter would not have been possible. The Allred decendants are estimated to be over 70,000. Don considers this estimate to be a little low.

WORK



She is gathering information for another book, this time on the life of Reuben W. Allred. If this book is anything like her last book (Kiss The Babies For Me) it will be an instant sell out.

One thing that consumes most of her time, is the documentation through birth, death, and other records, of the family line. She has completed all of the E.L. Allred line and is now working backwards in the R.W. Allred line.

Dawnell has hundreds of family photos, and is more than willing to share her knowledge and help you to get copies of your family's photo's. If you have any old photo's to share, she is the one to contact. If you want help in identifing people, she is also very willing. With the new inovation of the lazer copy machine, it is a simple matter to make a copy of your old photo's, and send her one at very little cost. 
### WORN YOU GIR

James Allred, founder of Spring City, 1784-1876

James Allred was a friend to the Prophe Joseph Smith. He endured all the hardships and persecutions that fell upon the early saints.

The following information on the life of James Allred is taken (with permission) from the book "Kiss the Babies For Me", by Dawnell Griffin:

"At Carthage Jail, the Prophet (Joseph) handed his sword to James Allred and told him he might need it to defend himself. This sword is, at this time, in the possession of Hal Edwards, a third greatgrandson. After the martyldom of the Prophet, James Allred went with his sleigh to the jail and brought the badly wounded John Taylor across the fields to the Taylor home."

"In the fall of 1851, President Brigham Young advised "Father Allred" (James) to select a place for settlement where he could locate with his numerous posterity and kindred to preside over them. He chose for his colony what is now known as Spring City, Utah originally called "The Allred Settlement."

Isaac Allred, son of William Allred & Elizabeth Thresher was born Jan. 27, 1788 in Pendleton So. Carolina. He was one of eight children. At the age of 22 he married Mary Calvert. They settled in the community of Farmington in Marshall Co. Tenn. They lived there for 18 years and had 10 of their children there.

In 1830 the family moved 1000 miles west to Monroe Co. Mo. Isaac's brother James and several of James's married sons had moved there the previous fall and founded what later became known as "Alired Settlement."

Two years later (in 1832) Hyrum Smith and John Murdock preached of a new Prophet by the name of Joseph Smith. James, Isaac and several other Allred families were baptized. It was here that Isaac and Mary had their 11th and 12th children.

When the saints were driven out of Monroe Co. the Allred's moved about 100 miles farther west and settled in Caldwell Co. Mary gave birth to her 13th child here.

The saints were once again driven from their homes by the extermination order of Gov. Boggs. Isaac, Mary and their 13 children moved about 200 miles back east to Hancock Co. Ill.


Isaac and his brother James and their families suffered much as they fled from devistated Caldwell Co. They had lost almost everything.

Isaac was a mason and he worked desperatly to assist in completion of the Nauvoo Temple. In rags and without much food they struggled until the temple was completed, and it was there that he and his beloved wife Mary recieved their endowments.

Anxious to own property in Nauvoo, Isaac placed himself under bond to a loc land owner, in order to purchase land. The family lived in Nauvoo until 1846 when they were once again forced to flee for their lives. They crossed the Mo. River on the ice in Feb. 1846. After much deprivation, suffering and sorrow, the family struggled across the whole state of Iowa to a point 8 miles east of Council Bluffs. Here he and James and the families including other Allred's formed camp and planted crops. They stayed in what was called "Allred Camp". until 1849 when they moved west in the Allen Taylor Co. They arrived in Salt Lake on Oct. 10, 1849. Only two years after Isaac and Mary arrived in the valley Isaac's beloved wife Mary passed away.

Two years later Isaac married a widow lady by the name of Matilda Stewart Park. They moved to Spring City and with his brother James was one of the faithful pioneer families. In his declining years he was cared for by his sons that surrou ded him in Spring City. He was highly esteemed by all who knew him.






Burial sight of ISAAC ALLRED in the Pioneer Cemetary, Spring City, Utah.


